Although the Celebration on Ice commemorates the end of our skating season, SABAH doesn't slow down when the show is over! During the spring and summer months, SABAH has several programs that keep our athletes active, engaged, and healthy. Just weeks after the Celebration on Ice show, SABAH began The Children's Guild Foundation's Summer Athletes Bold At Heart program. This school day program served 353 children challenged by disability on the sport court surface at the Cazenovia Rink. Over the course of the spring program, children learned adaptive skills for activities such as volleyball, soccer, and yoga. They also learned nutritional skills through the program's "Healthy Challenge" curriculum.

At the conclusion of the sport court programs, many of SABAH's athletes enjoyed the annual Summer Skates program at the Northtown Center at Amherst. Over 35 SABAH athletes participated in the five week program during July and August, where they escaped from the heat to reconnect with friends and brush up on their skating skills.

SABAH's Adults Fit and Fun program was also offered during the spring and summer months on the sport court surface at the Cazenovia Rink. From May through June, over 120 adults with special needs participated in a program which increased physical activity, taught adaptive sports skills, and provided participants with the nutritional information and the tools for a healthier lifestyle.
